Elements: facilitator's help guide – examples of connections

The teams that have the element/s listed on the card will participate in this round. Place the element/s on the central board.


A team that does not have at least one of the elements can select an element from those it has, add it to the board, and participate.

The facilitator declares "Let's go!" and from that moment, teams must think of an example of mutual responsibility, created from the combination of all the elements on the board. (**Time to think:** 1.5 minutes.)

The first group to shout out "mutual responsibility" will be asked to present its "connection" for about a minute, and will receive a "good deed" coin. **The goal is to collect as many coins as possible.**

▲ A group can present its "connection" in any way it chooses – story, acting, rap...

After presenting the "connection," read out the "Worth Knowing" on the other side of the card.

 **For the facilitator** – you can read out the following example to get the participants into the mood and the type of "connection" stories we're looking for:

Elements: Social media, Israeli flag, cooked food in pot, money, letter, car.

Example of associative "connection" story: A young woman decided to pamper her brother's army unit with homemade food. She posted on social media and within seconds, dozens of people contacted her, asking where to bring their pots. Many others offered money to help her buy treats for the soldiers. Her nephew's classmates wrote letters to the soldiers and they traveled in her car to the base. At the entrance was an Israeli flag, which at first hid her brother, who had come to the gate with tears in his eyes...



Here you can see examples of elements and ideas for possible connections. These connections are based on actual activities and illustrate creative thinking – what can be done using the various elements.

The **ambulance** can represent:

1. Contributions of medicines and medical equipment to evacuees.
2. Medical assistance to evacuees provided by volunteer medical teams.
3. Attempts to get drugs to the hostages.
4. Donations of advanced medical equipment to the security forces.
5. Contributions from abroad and from Israel to buy new ambulances.

The **money** can represent:

1. Donations from Israel and the world for various purposes and NGOs.
2. Food and equipment for evacuees and members of the security forces.
3. Donations for buying ambulances.
4. Donations for soldiers' transport home.
5. Donations to help families of the hostages.
6. Donations for children's toys.

The **camera** can represent:

1. Massive use of cameras for PR on social networks.
2. Perpetuating testimonies from survivors of Gaza border communities and the Nova party.
3. Volunteering to photograph/video joyous events, for example, a bar/mitzvah of children evicted from their homes.

The **hoe and vegetables** can represent:

1. Volunteering in agriculture.
2. Buying directly from farmers from the Gaza Envelope and Upper Galilee.
3. Establishing community gardens across the country.

The **Israeli flag** can represent:

1. National Pride: Many flags were hung on balconies and in streets.
2. Many Israeli companies have added Israeli flags to their app design.
3. Honor for the fallen. Many citizens wave Israeli flags near the homes of the fallen, as their families leave for the funeral.
4. Israel solidarity rallies around the world.
